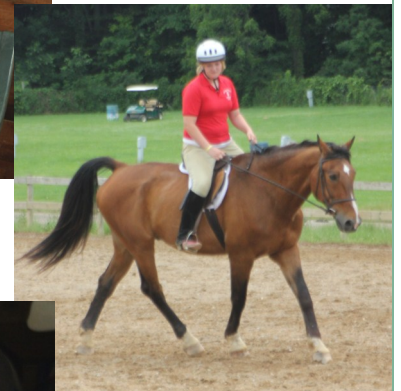
Here are a few highlights:

Why do the Kids Get to Have All the Fun?

Hey moms and dads! Are you tired of the kids getting to have all the fun? Have you had enough of just sitting and watching riding lessons? Are you ready to jump in and join the fun for yourself?

Well, now's your chance!

During the months of September and October if your child (or children) take at least six riding lessons you can get \$15 off of a riding lesson for yourself!

Parent's riding lesson must be taken by the end of November. One offer per parent.

A Horse of Your Own - Well, Almost

Here's how you can enjoy the fun of having a horse of your own without the expense.

Stepping Stone Farm offers our school horses for partial lease to current students who have reached a level of independence and riding skill.

Riders must be able to catch, groom, tack, ride, cool out, and put away their leased

horse safely on their own or with a parent's help to be eligible for a lease. Riders must also take at least 2 lessons per month while leasing.

With a partial lease riders get 3 rides per week and the opportunity to show their leased horse. Cost for a month lease is \$100 payable at the beginning of each month.

Leasing provides riders with time in the saddle to practice what they are learning in lessons and build confidence in their riding. It also gives riders a chance to enjoy some time riding with other farm friends.

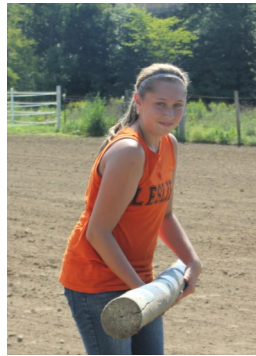
